Colossians 2:16-23 is a key biblical text that warns against any cult or philosophy of religion that stresses human works (i.e., things like legal obedience, ceremonies, dietary rules, secret names, wardrobe rules, asceticism, or other works you can perform and supposedly achieve holiness or salvation through ritualized self-denial.)

Pseudo-Christian Cults.

Pseudo-Christian cults deny or distort fundamental Christian doctrines such as the Trinity, the deity of Christ, and salvation by grace through faith alone. Examples of cults falling into this category are the Mormons, Jehovah’s Witnesses, Seventh-Day Adventism, Christian Science, The Way International, and the Unity School of Christianity. Most of these cults claim to be Christian, and even consider the Bible to be authoritative, but manipulate the Scriptures to fit their own beliefs. Although they may claim to serve Jesus Christ, and may even use the same terminology orthodox Christians use, their definitions are vastly different. These groups do not lead to the Christ of the Bible, but to another Jesus and another gospel (2 Cor. 11:1-4; Gal. 1:8,9).

Wicca.

Wicca draws from the old traditions of witchcraft. While Witchcraft and Wicca are similar in many respects, they are not the same. One can be a Witch, without being a Wiccan - Wicca is a recognized religion, while Witchcraft itself is not considered a religion. Thus, Wicca might best be described as a modern religion, based on ancient Witchcraft traditions.

New Age.

New Age is a term applied to a range of spiritual or religious beliefs and practices that developed in Western nations during the 1970s. Precise scholarly definitions of the New Age differ in their emphasis, largely as a result of its highly eclectic structure. Although analytically often considered to be religious, those involved in it typically emphasize beliefs outside the mainstream (such as reincarnation, holism, pantheism, and occultism) that advance alternative approaches to “spirituality” and rarely use the term "New Age" themselves. Theologically, the New Age typically adopts a belief in a holistic form of divinity that imbues the entire universe, including human beings themselves. There is a strong emphasis on the spiritual authority of the self. This is accompanied by a common belief in a wide variety of semi-divine non-human entities, such as angels and masters, with whom humans can communicate, particularly through the form of channeling.
